We welcome you to explore the beauty and abundant outdoor recreation found in Newaygo County and kindly remind all visitors to do their part in conserving that natural beauty for future generations by following the 7 key principles of Leave No Trace™ as outlined by the USFS and National Park Services. Thank you for preserving our natural resources!

## ☐ Plan Ahead & Prepare

Planning is critical to any successful outdoor adventure. Know the rules and regulations of where you are planning to visit. Prepare for emergencies. Visit in small groups when possible to minimize impact, repackage food to minimize waste and always have a map handy.

## ☐ Seek Durable Surfaces

Travel and camp on durable surfaces to avoid natural impact. Concentrate on using existing or marked campsite areas. Please respect the 200' rule and camp at least 200' from lakes, rivers and streams.

## ☐ Dispose of Waste

Proper disposal of waste is critical to the preservation of our natural resources. Whatever you bring in . pack it out. Dispose of solid human waste in holes at least 6" deep and 200' from any water sources.

## **□** Leave what you Find

Enjoy the view, but leave it where you found it. Leave rocks, plants and other natural objects.

## **☐** Minimize Campfires

Campfires can have a lasting impact to the eco system, so please reserve fires for designated fire rings if possible and please ensure all fires are completly put out before leaving the area.

## ☐ Respect Wildlife

This is their home, so please do not approach or disrupt their natural habitats

## ☐ Be Considerate of other Visitors

Be considerate to others using the trails and nature areas. Yield to other trail users and respect the sounds of nature.
